Discussion and possible resolution with respect to Council File 20-0838, directing the Department of Transportation, with assistance of the Chief Legislative Analyst, City Attorney, and Streets LA, to report back on the feasibility of developing a permanent network of Slow Streets to enable wider access to open spaces for all Angelenos.
